Scientist, Technologist or Social Scientist within authentic contexts, while integrating and exploring links within and across other curriculum areas, empowering them with the skills, tools, competencies and self

The introduction and application of tools for thinking and learning enables students to become reflective thinkers and effective problem solvers, while fostering increasing independence. Setting realistic, attainable goals improves self-efficacy.

Each area of the New Zealand Curriculum (NZC) is seen as unique and distinct and yet the natural connections between the areas provides opportunities to enrich learning experiences.

Literacy is central to learning across all areas of the curriculum. Reading and writing programs are continually reviewed and reflected upon to ensure children reach a level of literacy that will enable them to succeed in all areas.

Mathematics is structured so that students develop the necessary numeracy skills that will enable them to interpret, communicate and calculate geometrical, measurement, statistical and number problems.

Opportunities exist for students to participate in a variety of curricular and extra curricular physical and health related activities that promote hauora.

Literacy

Literacy Learners at Karaka School will be empowered to become effective and confident communicators through developing the necessary abilities and attributes needed to engage in literacy activities as they learn the code, think critically and make meaning.

Literacy learning is about developing the ability to become effective oral, written and visual communicators in order to be able to fully participate in local and global communities. Learners at Karaka will be given the tools and mindset to become increasingly skilled and sophisticated speakers and listeners, writers and readers, presenters and viewers.

We will develop this through the school-wide implementation of assessment for learning practises and pathways, enabling explicit and effective teaching for creative thinking and learning. Inquiry will be implemented within a supportive and nurturing learning environment pursuing excellence based around quality texts and authentic purposes for communicating.

Mathematics

Mathematics education at Karaka School will be designed to prepare students to become active participants and contributors in all areas of life. Underpinning mathematics teaching will be Visible learning including Assessment for Learning Pedagogy and practices and an alignment to the school's strategic vision. The mathematics programme will be developed from a pedagogical perspective and therefore targeted to ensure learners achieve their learning outcomes. In order to do this data from a range of sources will be collected, collated and analysed. A diverse programme encompassing number knowledge and strategies along with strand will ensure students are provided with multiple opportunities to become confident mathematicians.

Students at Karaka will be able to use multiple sources to learn including materials, representations and assistive technologies. Students will be encouraged to manage their learning by selecting appropriate tools that will help them to develop their next learning steps. In this way differentiated learning is easily achieved.
