## Start of the Year Information from the Office:

- The School Office opening times are 8.15am–3pm.
- The newsletter will be emailed fortnightly on Wednesdays. It is also available on our website [www.karaka.school.nz](http://www.karaka.school.nz)
- Our bus bell goes at 2.40pm when bus children are released to go to bus lines. For all other children the school day finishes at 2.45pm. Could parents please collect their child from the concrete or grass area beside the hall and administration block.
- Assemblies occur fortnightly. They will be held on the Friday of even weeks with the first assembly being on **12th February at 1.50pm**. Whole school assemblies will alternate with team assemblies. School parents and whanau are welcome to attend school assemblies.

- **School Stationery/Accounts:** A letter outlining all details for the Office Max ordering of stationery was sent out previously. Stationery can be purchased from the Office Max website [www.myschool.co.nz](http://www.myschool.co.nz) or from the Office Max store in Manukau. Please see the office if you have any problems.
- Please note that there is a discount of \$25.00 for school donations that are paid by the end of term 1. If you need to arrange a payment plan please see us in the office.
- **Absences:** If for any reason on a given day, your child will not be attending school, please make a phone call to the school office before 9.30am or send notice via the Karaka School website so that we know your child will not be at school and is safe. Calls are made to the parent/guardian by 9.30am if there is an unexplained absence .



- **Sun Safe:** Karaka School Safe Sun Policy states that during Term 1 & 4 children are required to have a suitable hat that gives protection to the face, ears and neck. We strongly suggest that our official school hat is the most suitable for this. Hats are in stock. These are sold in the uniform shop (Open Monday 8.15-9.00) or in the office - \$17.00 each.
- **Swimming:** Swimming is an important part of the school physical education programme. The school pool has undergone an upgrade over the holiday period and we hope to be able to have it open next week for swimming. Our sincere thanks to the PTA for making these upgrades possible.
- **School Uniform:** All children at all levels of the school are required to wear the full Karaka School uniform on a daily basis. Just a reminder, that specific footwear is included. For summer this is either **black sandals with a back strap** – black crocs are OK. For winter this will be black shoes (black sneakers acceptable) with black or navy socks. Hair accessories are to be black or blue only. All children representing the school at interschool sporting fixtures will also be expected to wear the official sports uniform which is available from the uniform shop. We look forward to our students looking smart from top to toe and believe this further enhances our positive image and promotes the school's identity throughout the community. **Please ensure that all items of your child's uniform are named.**
- The uniform shop is located in the hall meeting room. Please see Claire Monteith for sales on Monday morning's 8.15am to 9am.
- **School Banking:** We will be continuing with the ASB School Banking. Registration forms are available from the office if you wish to start school banking. **School banking day is Thursday.** A secure box is located in the office on the outside wall of the sickbay (enter through the rear door to place in the box). All deposits are taken to the bank on Friday.
- **Technology:** All year 7 and 8's have received a notice re attending tech at Mansell. This starts next Wednesday 10th February.

The tech fees per year will remain at \$65.00.

This needs to be paid before the end of Term 1 please.



- **School Bus Travel:** Parents are reminded that the school bus service runs under strict rules and regulations for health and safety reasons. If your child travelled by bus last year you should have already viewed and signed a bus transport contract with the school. If in doubt, please check with the office. If you are picking your child up after school and have not advised the office in advance please ensure that the teacher on bus duty is informed.
- **Bus Fees:** Bus fees (if applicable) must be received within the first two weeks of each term and a reminder letter will be sent should these remain outstanding.
- **School Car Parks:** Please take care when using our school car park and our drop off/pick up bay. The most important rule is to use your common sense. Please do not leave your car in the bus bay or drop off area! Cars parked here, should have drivers in them at all times! Our buses do not always arrive at the same time. Remember this is a “pick up and drop off area” only.
- **Out of Bounds Area:** For reasons of safety we would like all children and parents to enter and exit the school past the main office and not through the staff car park behind kotare (Room 10). This area is out of bounds for students. Bus students will need to make their way to and from the bus bay along the front of the office block, as do students who are dropped off in the 'drop off zone' when the bus is not present. A reminder to all parents: Please do not use the staff car park behind kotare (Room 10) as a drop off point.
- **2016 Head Students:** Students wishing to be chosen as a Head Student will present a speech to the Senior and Middle teams on Friday 19th at 1.30pm in the Hall. Parents/family are welcome to attend.
- **Camps:** Camps this year will be held 23rd to 27th May. Notices were sent home on Tuesday for those parents interested in being a parent helper. **Deposit of \$100 is due by next Friday 12th February.**

## Karaka School Senior Swimming Sports

On Friday 26th February, Karaka School will be holding it's senior swimming sports day for Year 5 to 8 students which will be held at the Franklin Pool and Leisure Centre in Pukekohe. This day will be split into two events:

Non-Championships Event: The aim of this day is for the students to build on their water confidence and swimming skills by competing in fun races against other students in the year group.

Championships Event: These students have been selected because they have shown that they are capable of swimming and completing 25m in one or more of the following strokes—freestyle, backstroke and breaststroke (selected Year 3 and 4 students will be chosen to swim in this event). The aim of this day is for students to compete competitively within their year group. Swimmers will be selected from this event to compete for Karaka School in the E.C.C.S swimming sports day on Wednesday 2nd March.

We will be asking for parent helpers to help out on the day and more information will be coming out soon about these two events.

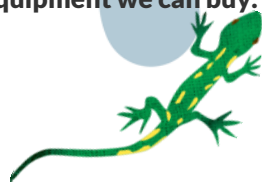
We encourage all students wishing to enter the triathlon to be prepared for the event to participate in the 6 week training programme appropriate for their age group.
