Setting Up for Success - Goal Setting

Thursday 20th February

The beginning of the year is an important time for all learners. It is a time to settle into their new environment, get to know their new teacher(s) and peers, and begin the next stage of their learning journey.

It is absolutely essential that you, their whanau, are a part of the process, therefore we ask that you come to school on Thursday 20th February.

How will the time be spent? The time will be learner led and will generally follow the outline below.

- *First your child will show you around their new learning space.
- *After that you and your child will sit together and reflect on your child's 2019 learning journey. This conversation will lead you to setting a learning and a values goal to start the year. Part of this discussion will include 'What can I do at school to help me achieve my goals' and 'What can we do at home to help me achieve my goals'.
- *Next your child will introduce you to their teacher. There will be an opportunity (approximately 5 minutes) to ask any questions, share any important information and to ensure everyone is aware of and committed to helping the learner achieve their goals.

In the coming weeks learners will be given opportunities to reflect on their goals at school and we encourage you to continue talking about and encouraging your child to achieve these at home.

The time slots are shared 30 minutes slots. This means there will be a number of families in the classroom at the same time and each family will have a chance to briefly chat with the teacher within the 30 minutes. It is important each whanau has time with the teacher, therefore more in depth conversations will require an appointment to be made on another day. Thank you for understanding and we look forward to seeing every learner and their whanau on Thursday 20th February.
