Safety Messages:

Now is a good time to be reminding our learners about the importance of everyday hygiene habits. We received the following advice to share with you:

- wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and dry thoroughly
- avoid touching eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands
- avoid sharing anything that has come in contact with saliva, whether in living or social environments
- stay home when sick and seek medical attention
- cover coughs or sneezes with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the rubbish
- Get adequate sleep and eat well-balanced meals to ensure a healthy immune system

We encourage our learners to develop skills to keep themselves safe at all times and in all situations. Below is some advice from the NZ Police that you can discuss with your children.

- Remember, you can always say <u>NO</u> to someone you don't know.
- If someone makes you feel unsafe or confused remember to : **Stop**, **Walk and Talk**.
- Tell the person "No!" Walk or run away from that person, and finally Talk about it or tell someone you trust.


