Contact Tracing is no longer required but keeping track of the places you have been is.	A QR code is available for scanning on the office door and on the door of the hall. This helps you to keep track of the places you have visited (this is optional). Our visitors book is located on the office desk.	Please remember to sign in or out at the office as you have done in the past if you are helping in a classroom or collecting your child early from school.
Safe hygiene practices remain a priority as does staying home if you are feeling unwell.	Hand sanitizer, soap and water and towels for drying hands will continue to be available. We will contact you if your child needs collecting from school if they are feeling unwell.	Please remind your child(ren) about the need to continue to wash their hands, cough or sneeze into elbows and to stay home if they are unwell.
