

Welcome back to the 2nd half of 2020! ! It has been lovely to hear the stories of our learners' holidays - there was a fair bit of exploring our beautiful Aotearoa going on! As we embark on what we hope is a more settled term ahead, we thought it would be a good idea to revisit some of the reminders we shared at the beginning of the year as well as share some upcoming events.

A BIG welcome to our place of learning to all those who are new to the Karaka School whanau. We have had so many new entrants that we have opened another room in Pepeketua. We have also had older learners join us throughout the school. To formally welcome them and our new teachers, Mr Glover, Mrs Vorster, Mrs Kenny and Mrs Redshaw, we will be holding a powhiri on Friday August 7th starting at 10.45am. We welcome all new families to attend and of course our existing families are welcome also. Class teachers will organise the new learners to meet by the flagpole at 10.40am and new parents and whanau can join them there.

The cornerstone of our Karaka School culture is our school values. At our place of learning we actively live and celebrate these on a day to day basis. They are our expectations of each other and we deliberately teach the skills and dispositions associated with each. We believe that our values are not only important values for our school but also important for life. The following poster is displayed in every classroom, our office area and also as you enter our school. Talk to your child about our school values and what these look like in action. You can support the development of these by using the language of, and celebrating our values at home too.



Due to Covid-19 we adapted our formal reporting programme. Written mid vear reports will be available for collection at our open afternoon on **Friday** August 7th. The format of the afternoon is more flexible than the learner led conferences we normally have. It is an opportunity to explore the classroom alongside your child and for them to share with you some learning they are particularly proud of. Teachers will be in the classes and available to have a quick chat. However, if you require a more formal conversation, remember that you are able to contact your child's class teacher at any time during the term. Email is a great way to initiate contact. The classes will be open between **1.45pm and 3.00pm**. If you plan to come at an earlier time and take your child home with you, please ensure you let the class teacher know as you leave. Remember to collect the written report on your way out as well. It is important that you (or an aunty, uncle, grandparent etc) attend, as maintaining and developing home school connections is an important part of your child's learning. We believe that the open afternoon and our more familiar learner led conferences are so incredibly valuable for our learners and their learning that we are **aiming for 100% attendance - help us to achieve** this!

Assemblies are back! Starting next Friday 31st July, we will be holding whole school assemblies once a fortnight in the hall. You are very welcome to attend. Assemblies start at 1.45pm. See you there!
