3 Way and Student Led Conferences

This term you will have the opportunity to share in your child's learning achievements at the scheduled 3 way and student led conferences on <u>Wednesday April 5th and Thursday April 6th</u>. School will close at lunchtime (12.20pm) on the Thursday to

ensure that we are able to accommodate all our families. Please collect your child from school at **12.20pm**. The bus will depart at the normal time – any bus children who are unable to be picked up will be supervised in the Library by Mrs Thorby. After School care will be operating from 12.20pm.

Children, with the support of their teachers, will share their recent learning, celebrate their achievements and share their next steps. This is an opportunity for parents to be genuinely involved in their child's learning by celebrating alongside your child and being able to identify how you are able to support learning at home in ways that will make a real difference to achieving identified goals.

3 way conferences are focused on the development of the learner. This means that the conversations will be learning focused and will include dialogue around academic achievements and next learning steps as well the development of the key competencies as described in the New Zealand Curriculum. Should you wish to discuss anything that does not fit in this brief; an alternative time to meet can be scheduled. Please email the teacher directly to initiate this. Remember, we are always available to meet with you at any time of the year should you have questions or concerns.

These opportunities to celebrate learning alongside your child are highly valuable and through your attendance you are showing your support for their learning journey. We are therefore aiming for **100%** attendance. The first class in each of the 3 teams that achieves 100% booked will receive a prize and all those who attend will go into a lucky prize draw for a family pass to the movies (2adults and 2 children).

Bookings can be made online and they will be open **Wednesday 22nd March.** Bookings will close at 3.00pm on **Tuesday 4th April.**

Time slots are 15 minutes in duration or senior team 30 minutes in duration.

Senior School Student Led Conferences

This year the senior school are trialling student led conferences. A **student led conference** is a meeting run by the **student** for his or her parents, entirely focused on the **student's** recent learning. During the **conference** the **student** presents work in different curriculum areas, discussing the process of learning and the progress made to date.

The main differences of student led conferences versus 3 way conferences are:

- Students will be sharing their own learning
- There will be up to 3 families in the room at one time
- Time slots will be 30 minutes long
- The teacher will be roving around to help out to support the student when required.

It is important to prevent interruptions of other students sharing with their parents therefore we request that siblings do not attend. The sole focus of these conferences is your child and their learning. Any other problems or questions that you may have could you please organise an appointment at another time.

Celebrating Learning

The school is alive with the sound of learning! It was incredibly rewarding to enter a classroom earlier this week and be stopped by a student who excitedly asked me to "wait right there" so that they could fetch their work to show me 'what' they had been learning and also to share the 'why' they were learning it and 'how' they knew they had been successful. A wonderful example of a learner owning their learning!

This year, we have committed to delving deeper into each of the 6 capabilities that underpin effective learning. We have been busy collecting student voice as well as analysing our practice alongside assessment for learning pedagogy. The inquiry into practice, combined with the student voices, has provided us with the opportunity to reflect and make evidenced based decisions regarding practice. This professional development is also proving to be a great way for our teachers to role model lifelong learning alongside their students!

Congratulations to all those students who represented us so well at the Franklin Schools triathlon last Friday. We were very impressed to hear how well you had all done with everyone completing the course. A special mention must go to **Logan S** who finished 2nd overall in his category - congratulations!


