### **Police Vetting**

Due to legislation effective from July 1<sup>st</sup> 2015 all volunteers working with children are required to be Police Vetted. This includes volunteers who put away books, help in classrooms, supervise groups on class trips, camps or transport children to and from events. If you wish to volunteer at our school please contact the office to request an application form to complete. Once you have completed the form please return it to the office and we will lodge this on your behalf. Police Vets are valid for 3 years.

We have been informed by the Police Vetting Agency that effective from 1st July 2017 there will be a charge for this. This will be around \$10.00. If you wish to volunteer at our school, we suggest you call in as soon as possible so we can get applications in before the 1st of July.
