IMPORTANT MEDICAL NOTICE

We have a student joining our Karaka School community that has a <u>severe food</u> <u>allergy</u> to many types of nuts (<u>pecans, cashews, peanuts and walnuts</u>). It is extremely important that there is <u>strict avoidance</u> of this food in order to prevent a <u>life-threatening</u> allergic reaction.

We are therefore asking for your help to provide the student with a safe school environment. Any exposure to these types of nuts may cause a life-threatening allergic reaction that requires emergency medical treatment. To reduce the chance of this occurring, we are asking that you <u>do not</u> send any of these nuts to school with your child. Both Karaka School and the child's family appreciate your assistance and thank you for your support.
