Clayton was very tired and cold and upset, and had a fair way still to go. I could see this, way off in the distance from the other side of the pond. The marshal had pulled him aside, but looked like he didn't know what to do with him. My heart was breaking, and there was nothing I could do!! Then along came two angels. They each took a hand and helped Clayton get all the way down the hill, across the muddy pond and then up the cargo net to get to the finish. I am so grateful to these wonderful young women, they went above and beyond expectations and helped a very distressed little boy. I think you should be very proud of the way they represented themselves and your school today. I was not the only one to notice, so it was pretty easy to work out where these two muddy angels were from. Brooklynn and Dhroux, thank you so very much.



The organiser of the event made special mention of this prior to prize giving, staff from other schools approached me to mention the girls and others (including the boy's mother) went out of their way to find out what school these girls went to and then phoned or emailed.
