Lunch Room News - Sushi is back!

Previously Sushi has been a very popular option on a Thursday from the Karaka School lunchroom however we haven't had it for a while due to supplier issues. We are very happy to say we have now found a supplier to provide us with sushi again. In addition to the regular Friday lunch room, the sushi lunch room will be open every Thursday starting the first week of term 3. You can place your sushi order from 8.20am until the start of the school day at 8.45am at the school hall lunch room (just like on Friday). All orders are delivered to your child's class room in time for lunch. To place a lunch order come to the kitchen in the hall where we will take your order or if you would rather not wait in line to place your order, you may put your order in the white "lunch room orders" box on the lunch room counter. You can now find an order form for both Thursday's and Friday's lunchroom on the school's website. If you do order your lunch using the box please ensure you put your order in a sealed envelope (old or new, or a small plastic bag) and make sure it is clearly labelled with your child's
