Kua Tae Te Wā update

After months of negotiations with the Ministry of Education, and more talks since the strike on August 15, we still have no new offer.

Our union, NZEI Te Riu Roa, continues to negotiate in good faith, but the Government says it will take time to fix the issues.

However, time is the one thing we don't have. Around the country we're seeing:

- 40% reduction in teacher trainees
- Zero applicants for some teaching jobs
- More children entering school
- More children with additional learning and behavioural needs
- Teachers are burning out and leaving the profession, often within a few years of graduating

The staff at our school want your children to have the very best education we can provide. We're standing firm in that commitment and believe the time is now to ensure that schools can offer every child the education and support they need, and that we have a sustainable teaching profession into the future. Our children can't wait. We won't wait.

We appreciate your support. Please talk to your child's teacher if you have any questions, and consider signing this petition to the Minister of Education in support of teachers.



KARAKA KASH CASHLESS TICKETS - ALL FOOD AND ACTIVITIES

All children's activities and food this year will be run using a cashless ticket system. With the exception of the coffee carts and donuts who are outside providers and will take both cash and cashless tickets.

Tickets will be sold in \$1 and \$2 values.

We will also have the option of a \$5 or \$10 purchase of cashless tickets made up from the \$1 & \$2 tickets.

The \$5 option will be 2x \$2 tickets + 1x \$1 ticket that will be stapled together to make the \$5 so then this can be used as \$5 or pulled apart to use separately depending on costs of the activity or stall.

The \$10 option will be 5x \$2 tickets stapled together to make \$10.

The amount of cashless tickets you purchase is up to you. An order form will be sent out next week for those wishing to avoid the queues on AG day. You will be able to pre-order Karaka Kash prior to Ag Day by sending your order and money to school. These orders will then be collated and placed in envelopes with your name on to be collected on AG Day.

Cashless ticket sales will also be available on the day from the Office. You will be able to pay with EFTPOS or cash for your cashless ticket purchases.

EFTPOS will still be available to pay for any auction items or if you prefer you can pay with cash for auction items ONLY.

It is important you use all the tickets you have purchased as there will be **NO REFUNDS** for unused tickets.
