2019 Enrolments



Lunch Room is open every Tuesday (sushi only) and Friday morning

Some lovely parents volunteer their time to run the lunch room which helps to raise money for the PTA. The PTA donates this money to the school to support many projects and initiatives for our children. The lunch room is open each Tuesday and Friday morning from 8.20am until the start of the school day at 8.45am. Your child's lunch is then delivered to their classroom in time for lunch. To place a lunch order you can either come to the kitchen in the hall where we will take your order or if you would rather not wait in line to place your order, you may put your order in the white "lunch room orders" box on the lunch room counter. If you do order your lunch using the box please ensure you put your order in a sealed envelope (old or new, or a small plastic bag) and make sure it is clearly labelled with your child's name, room name / number, the list of items they would like, your money (it is best if you can supply the correct change too please)

Tuesday is Sushi only—Friday is pies, sausage rolls, pizza, jucies, moosies, flavoured milk, popcorn, corn chips and fruit drinks

We would like to increase the number of volunteers who manage the orders each Tuesday and **Friday** morning in the lunch room.
