IT'S TIME YOUR CHILDREN HAD THE EDUCATION THEY DESERVE

Schools are facing a teacher shortage crisis, with a 40% drop in people training to be teachers; and a growing number of school-aged children. In term three, 50% of schools reported that they did not have enough teachers. Schools are struggling to attract teaching staff, and that problem looks set to worsen.

There is also a desperate need for more support for children with additional learning needs.

The governments offer fell significantly short of addressing these concerns and as a result, the teachers and principal's overwhelmingly rejected the offer and voted to carry out a rolling strike.

ALERGIES - IMPORTANT MEDICAL NOTICE

We have a student in our Karaka School community that has a <u>severe food allergy</u> to many types of nuts (<u>pecans, cashews, peanuts and walnuts</u>). It is extremely important that there is <u>strict avoidance</u> of this food in order to prevent a <u>life-threatening</u> allergic reaction.

We are therefore asking for your help to provide the student with a safe school environment. Any exposure to these types of nuts may cause a life-threatening allergic reaction that requires emergency medical treatment. To reduce the chance of this occurring, we are asking that you do not send any of these nuts to school with your child.
