Pony Update: Unfortunately due to lack of potential pony entries, the committee has made the hard decision to not have a pony category this year. We will relook at this next year.

Calf Opportunity: Chris and Sally Guy would like to offer the opportunity for children to have a calf for Ag Day. The farm is located directly opposite Karaka School, with the entrance to the milking shed from Karaka Road. Chris will select the calves with the children from the herd which will be put into a shed next to the milking shed where the children are required to come to feed, groom and walk their calves. Milk will be provided onsite daily.

What is required: maximum 4 children, at least 2 senior students, calves must be fed daily between 2.45-3.15pm. Calves must be fed on weekends as well however feeds may be done between 12-4pm. Children must be supervised by a parent/guardian while onsite. A course will be set up on site for the children to practice leading their calves through. Families must bring a halter, lead and brush.

In addition if anyone is interested in raising a beef calf there are some available. These would be either purchased or returned to the farm after Ag Day.

Little Guys would like to offer their help to feed and care for lambs during the day so that they can be fed while families are at work. We can take a maximum of 4 lambs. All milk, and bottles would need to be supplied daily. Drop off and pick up times are from 8am to 4.30pm.

Email Karaka reception if you are interested in any of the above and either Chris or Sally will be in touch.

Animal Stuff: Please support Animal Stuffs Drury as they have kindly donated food starter packs for students to take home when their chickens arrive. Animal Stuffs stores (Drury, Takanini and Waiuku) have been offering support and sponsorship to local schools for many years. They will also be supporting us by providing vouchers which we will use as part of prize packs on Ag Day.

DROWNING PREVENTION AUCKLAND

Drowning Prevention Auckland has just released a series of water safety programmes for the July school holidays that will run at pools around Auckland.

The Splash Holiday programme is a fun and safe opportunity for children aged 8-15 to improve their water safety competence and knowledge, while enhancing their swimming ability. Places are limited to 25 per day and cost \$30 per child.

A Message from Fulton Hogan and Waka Kotahi for the Community The night of Monday 26 June, we will fully close (24/7) the Papakura southbound on-ramp for up to three months, ie through to September. In addition, the Papakura southbound off-ramp extreme right-hand turn (Karaka direction) will be fully closed (24/7) for two months.

Motorists wanting to get onto the motorway heading south will be detoured via Beach Road and Great South Road to access the motorway at Drury Interchange.

Other key journey information follows

There will be an increase in vehicles on Great South Road and Beach Road during this extended southbound on-ramp closure.

During morning (AM) and afternoon peak (PM), moderate delays are expected at the following intersections:

- Hingaia Road, Harbourside Drive and Hinau Road (AM and PM)
- Beach Road, Elliot Street and Chichester Drive (PM only)
- Great South Road, Settlement Road and Beach Road (AM and PM)

Moderate delays at peak times are also expected for motorists on Waihoehoe Road approaching Drury's Great South Road/Waihoehoe Road/ Norrie Road roundabout.
