CELEBRATING LEARNING & ACHIEVEMENT

I hope everyone enjoyed the holiday break - I've heard about lots of exciting holidays, and also some nice relaxing whānau time at home, while chatting with the students back at school this week. For myself, I enjoyed some down time in between Dance

Competitions in Hamilton and Tauranga (my daughter not myself lol!) and a football tournament in Hamilton. A highlight for my daughter's team (and hubby Stu who has coached them for the last 6 years since they were all 4 years old) was their invitation to be ball girls for the friendly match between FIFA World Cup teams Spain and Vietnam on Matariki Friday. Our club at McLennon Park in Papakura is the Spanish team's home base and our girls

were thrilled to be invited - although I don't think they realised quite how much 'standing around' there is when you're a ball girl. Parents weren't allowed into the clubrooms with the girls after the game either as it is all very tight security, but our girls had fun taking selfies with the players and getting their balls signed. They even got to meet Alexia Putellus - dubbed by many as the best women's footballer in the world. Very exciting stuff if you're into football!



Now for an update on the home learning front (also known as 'Homework' or 'Learning at Home'). Last term, we found that we needed to have a look across the school at what was happening in this space in terms of consistency, and clarity for parents, particularly in Year 3-8. This sparked an in depth review with our Leadership Team as to what was happening across teams. We found that in 2019, the school made a deliberate decision to move away from 'traditional homework sheets' and look at home learning in a more holistic way. However, Covid/Remote Learning intervened and blurred the lines (as it did in so many ways), and along with a changeover of staff, we have ended up in a situation where some classes provide homework and others don't. So what we have decided is to go back to the original decision that was made. We are looking to create other avenues for home learning that don't involve setting a homework sheet (that ultimately doesn't benefit the student or teacher in terms of progress and achievement).

What we will be offering from now on, is a wide range of resources and activities endorsed by the Ministry for parents to utilise if they wish to provide home learning tasks for their child to complete at home. For Junior classes, you can still expect a reader/phonics/alphabet activities to come home each night, as well as early number tasks if applicable. The link to this can be found on the document attached below which also outlines our school philosophy behind homework. We are also in the process of getting these resources uploaded onto our website.

For those students who have a genuine self motivated interest in being extended in terms of their learning at home, Mr Dyer (with my support) will be available to work with these students after school from 2:45-3:15pm on Thursdays starting next week. The aim will be to provide authentic learning experiences that can be worked on at home, and then monitored/extended/shared at these weekly sessions. Term 3 Illness and Medication

- A reminder that at this time of year there are lots of bugs about. To
 help stop the spread, please keep your child home if they are unwell
 and ensure 24 hours have passed before sending your child to school
 after a stomach upset.
- Please be aware that all medication administered to a child must be brought to the office in the first instance. Medication must not be taken to the classroom or put in your child's lunchbox. - Hand washing is the simplest and most effective means to prevent, control and reduce infection. This includes colds, influenza and stomach bugs. Hands need to be washed and dried properly. Wet hands transfer bacteria more readily than dry hands which have not been washed at all.
