

SH1 northbound and southbound lanes shifting east

With road widening on the southbound side of the motorway being completed over the coming week, we are ready to move to the next phase of construction works. The next phase (Phase Three) involves all motorway lanes being shifted across to the east to create more room to build up pavement and widen the motorway on the northbound side.

What is happening?

Overnight on Wednesday 30 August, subject to weather, the two existing southbound lanes will shift to the east, from the Papakura Interchange down to the BP service centre.

Overnight on Thursday 31 August, subject to weather, the two existing northbound lanes will shift to the east, from before the BP service centre (on the opposite side of the motorway) to north of Papakura Interchange.

The most important message related to this switch is - northbound drivers who want to exit the motorway at Papakura northbound off-ramp MUST move into the left-hand lane before reaching the BP service centre on the opposite side.

After that point, the central median barrier will separate the left-hand (slow) and right-hand (fast) northbound lanes (known as a 'Bull Run'), as shown on page 2. If you're in the right-hand lane once you're in the Bull Run, then your next opportunity to exit the motorway will be at Takanini Interchange, not Papakura.

The Papakura southbound loop on-ramp will then reopen overnight on Sunday 3 September.

How does this work affect me?

Night work hours - 9pm to 5am with crews permitted to arrive/set up and pack up/exit outside of these hours. This traffic switch is weather dependent and will be moved to a subsequent night/s if required.

Noise and vibration - Any noise and vibration associated with these works will be within the limits required of us.


All work areas will be cordoned off to ensure public safety.
