- EOTC consent form.
- · Health form.
- In-zone enrolment questionnaire
- Signed copy of the school-wide rules.



All of the following documents must be attached in PDF or JPEG format.

- Student's NZ birth certificate or passport if neither of these apply then confirmation of NZ citizenship, or a passprt with a valid sutdent/resident visa is required.
- · Any legal documentation regarding guardianship or custody rights.
- · Electricity or water account
- · Tenancy agreement or rates bill
- · Student's latest school report.
- . Immunisation record (e.g measles vacination this can be obtained from your doctor)


Out-of-Zone Enrolments

In 2024, we <u>may</u> offer up to 30 outof-zone places at Rosehill College. To apply, you must contact the college on 295 0695

Applications for out-of-zone students must be received no later than 30 August 2023. Please note that not be noted that included in the ballot which will be held on 6 September 2023.

Out-of-Zone Priorities

- First priority must be given to any applicant who is accepted for enrolment in a special programme run by the school.
- Second priority must be given to any applicant who is the sibling of a current student of the school.
- Third priority must be given to any student who is the sibling of a former student of the school.
- Fourth priority must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- Fifth priority must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the Board or a child of a member of the Board of the school.
- 6. Sixth priority must be given to all other applicants.

Kia ora

The Papakura to Drury project's new Traffic Layout has been pushed out by one week and will now take place as follows:

- Overnight Wednesday 6 September both southbound lanes will be shifted east and the Papakura southbound on-ramp will also open, no later than 5am on Thursday 7 September.
- Overnight Thursday 7 September both northbound lanes will be shifted east and the Papakura southbound on-ramp will open, no later than 5am on Friday 8 September.

The most important message related to this switch is - northbound drivers who want to exit the motorway at Papakura northbound off-ramp MUST move into the left-hand lane before reaching the BP service centre on the opposite side.

After that point, the central median barrier will separate the left-hand (slow) and right-hand (fast) northbound lanes (known as a 'Bull Run').

If you're in the right-hand lane once you're in the Bull Run, then your next opportunity to exit the motorway will be at Takanini Interchange, not Papakura.

This Traffic Layout is expected to remain in place until mid-2024.
